

Judge Orr Eastonville Mineral Rights Statement

Title work for **Lot 1177, Woodmen Hills Filing No. 10, as amended by Surveyor's Affidavit recorded December 13, 2002 at Reception No. 202221963, County of El Paso, State of Colorado** shows that Juanita Hudson owns $\frac{1}{2}$ of the mineral rights. Research by Mr. and Mrs. Buford found that Juanita Hudson died in 2017 at 101 years of age. Two daughters survived her and live(d) in Colorado Springs. They have looked and paid twice to find an address or phone number on either one of them and cannot find a reliable location or reliable phone number for either Lucille Muhe or Retha Cook. There are no obituaries so they may still be alive.

We are not sure if these daughters inherited the mineral rights from their mother. It is not possible to find and notify any owners of severed rights for this property.
