Dear James Hull:

You have requested technical assistance from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service; we) regarding your proposal to construct a driveway on your property along Hay Creek in El Paso County, Colorado. The project consists of an upgrade to a stream crossing on your property that includes habitat that might be suitable for Preble's meadow jumping mouse (*Zapus hudsonius preblei*; mouse), listed as threatened under the Endangered Species Act (ESA). Our review is consistent with our authority under the ESA of 1973, as amended (16 U.S.C. 1531 *et seq.*).

We received your letter and description of the project from you on January 30, 2024. We do not anticipate that this project will use Federal funding or oversight nor impact waters of the U.S., resulting in the need for a permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers; therefore, no Federal nexus is present.

As noted in our previous response, you plan to have the driveway construction at the narrowest point, adjacent to Hay Creek, through riparian habitat. We believe you will minimize impacts on mouse habitat by constructing the driveway through the narrowest part of the suitable habitat. In addition, after discussing the project over the phone, you chose some additional Service-approved measures that will further reduce impacts on the mouse during the construction of your project. We have attached these agreed-upon measures to this email for reference.

Given that no activities associated with the project would occur within the designated critical habitat that you have committed to the above conservation measures, we feel that take is not reasonably certain to occur to Preble's meadow jumping mouse because of this proposed project.

We appreciate your request for assistance and encourage you to contact us again if the scope of the project changes or new information indicates that the project may result in take of a listed species. We also encourage you to pass our contact information to construction contractors in the event there are any questions or points of clarification.
