Ellicott Town Center Final Plat Extension, SF-18-025

Please accept the comments below from El Paso County Public Health (EPCPH) regarding the Filing No. 1 Final Plat Extension project referenced above:

- Ellicott Utilities Company, LLC (EUC) has committed to provide water and
 wastewater services pending the execution of a water and wastewater Service
 Agreement with the developer, Colorado Springs Mayberry, LLC. There is a
 28June2018 Water and Wastewater Service Commitment letter from EUC
 reiterating the statement above. The Colorado Department of Public Health
 and Environment CDPHE), Water Quality Control Division (WQCD) has issued
 PWSID # CO0121245 the EUC. There is a finding for sufficiency in terms of
 water quality for this WQCD regulated water system.
- JPS Engineering has provided supporting documentation on the sufficiency of water and wastewater service capacity for Ellicott Town Center-Filing No. 1 and Filing No. 2, in the Water Resources Report and Wastewater Treatment Report, dated 24Aug2018 and revised 27Mar2019.
- El Paso County Public Health encourages planned walk-ability of residential communities with sidewalks, walking paths, and bike trails to surrounding neighborhood parks, schools and commercial areas. Walk-ability features promote exercise, help reduce obesity and lower the risk of heart disease.
- Earthmoving activities greater than 25 acres require a Construction Activity
 Permit from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Air
 Pollution Control Division. Go to:

- Radon resistant construction building techniques/practices are encouraged in this area. The EPA has determined that Colorado, and specifically the El Paso County area, have higher radon levels than other areas of the country.
- The water quality basin must have mosquito control responsibilities included as a part of the construction design and maintenance plan to help control mosquito breeding habitat and minimize the potential for West Nile Virus.
