RE: Stonebridge Filing No. 4 at Meridian Ranch – Final Plat – (SF-18-023)

This is to inform you that the above-reference request for approval of final plat was heard and approved by the El Paso County Planning Commission on January 15, 2019, at which time a recommendation for approval was made to approve a final plat to create 209 single-family lots, rights-of-way, and utility and open space tracts. A concurrent application has been filed requesting approval of a combined planned unit development and preliminary plan (PUDSP) to rezone the two parcels, totaling 68 acres, pursuant to the Stonebridge at Meridian Ranch PUD (Planned Unit Development). The property is located at the northwest corner of the Eastonville Road and Stapleton Drive intersection and is within Sections 29 and 30, Township 12 South, Range 64 West of the 6th P.M. The parcels are included within the boundaries of the Falcon/Peyton Small Area Master Plan (2008). (Parcel Nos. 42000-00-413 and 42000-00-415)

This recommendation for approval is subject to the following:

CONDITIONS

- 1. All Deed of Trust holders shall ratify the plat. The applicant shall provide a current title commitment at the time of submittal of the Mylar for recording.
- 2. Colorado statute requires that at the time of the approval of platting, the subdivider provides the certification of the County Treasurer's Office that all ad valorem taxes applicable to such subdivided land, or years prior to that year in which approval is granted, have been paid. Therefore, this plat is approved by the Board of County Commissioners on the condition that the subdivider or developer must provide to the



Planning and Community Development Department, at the time of recording the plat, a certification from the County Treasurer's Office that all prior years' taxes have been paid in full.

- 3. The subdivider or developer must pay, for each parcel of property, the fee for tax certification in effect at the time of recording the plat.
- 4. The Applicant shall submit the Mylar to Enumerations for addressing.
- 5. Developer shall comply with federal and state laws, regulations, ordinances, review and permit requirements, and other agency requirements, if any, of applicable agencies including, but not limited to, the Colorado Division of Wildlife, Colorado Department of Transportation, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service regarding the Endangered Species Act, particularly as it relates to the Preble's Meadow Jumping Mouse as a listed species.
- 6. Driveway permits will be required for each access to an El Paso County owned and maintained roadway. Driveway permits are obtained from the El Paso County Planning and Community Development Department.
- 7. The subdivision improvements agreement, including the financial assurance estimate, as approved by the El Paso County Planning and Community Development Department, shall be filed at the time of recording the final plat.
- 8. Collateral sufficient to ensure that the public improvements as listed in the approved financial assurance estimate shall be provided when the final plat is recorded.
- 9. Drainage fees in the amount of \$171,091.00 and bridge fees in the amount of \$65,282.00 for the Bennett Ranch drainage basin (CHWS1200) shall be paid (or credits used) to El Paso County at the time of final plat recordation.
- 10. Drainage fees in the amount of \$89,906.00 and bridge fees in the amount of \$13,268.00 for the Haegler Ranch drainage basin (CHMS0200) shall be paid to El Paso County at the time of final plat recordation.

NOTATIONS

1. Final plats not recorded within 24 months of Board of County Commissioner approval shall be deemed expired, unless an extension is approved.

- 2. Per Board of County Commissioners Resolution 13-41, property within the Woodmen Road Metropolitan District is currently exempt from participation within the El Paso County Road Impact Fee Program.
- 3. No fees in lieu of school land dedication are required with the recordation of the final plat. All school land dedication requirements have been satisfied for the Meridian Ranch Development.

The Planning Commission is advisory to the Board of County Commissioners.
