RE: Colorado Springs Police Department (CSPD) Firing Range at PPIR – Projected Traffic Information  
Date: September 16, 2019

This memorandum presents expected traffic numbers for the proposed CSPD firing range facility to be located on a 17.2-acre parcel north of the Pikes Peak International Raceway facility.

- Estimated 29 trips to and from the range on daily basis, Monday-Friday, with 75 percent of these trips occurring between 7am and 5pm.
- Less than one percent of the trips will occur between 4pm and 11pm. (Nighttime use of the range is one time per quarter).
- Weekend use is rare and may only occur on average about 5-6 times per year between 7am and 5pm. The average number of trips on weekends would be slightly lower than weekday usage, with an estimate of 15 trips to and from.
- 95 percent of all trips will be coming from the north. The other 5 percent would be from either the south or east.
- The annual number of vehicles driving to the CSPD Firing Range at PPIR will be between 6570 – 7496 vehicles. It is anticipated that some of our large vehicles (approx. weight 33,000 lbs.) will need access to the range 4 times per year. In addition, the range would receive ammunition deliveries 4-8 times per year on semi-trucks.
