Morning Chris,

So, first, here is the map resource you can use to search for the items I have attached.

I downloaded 5 LSWT permits that are located in your approximate area. Without knowing the full dimensions/pipe construction type of your pond, it would seem likely that one of these represents your pond as an already permitted LSWT.

My apologies for making an over presumptive statement in my email earlier. I did not know or lookup your site's usage. I have seen situations where residential developers try to claim the LSWT permit for the most recent subdivision in the Springs with clearly no intention of livestock on property. I don't see why the permitted LSWT **wouldn't** still apply for your site, based on your description of its history and planned usage.

I would suggest you take some time to review the details of these 5 approved tanks and see which one would most likely be your structure. Look for things that match like crest length, size of outlet pipe, spillway width and then use that for presentation to the County.

Hope that helps and you can avoid the whole NOI thing.
