Dear Mr. Fitzpatrick and El Paso County Development Services Dept.

I am writing about the proposed planned development that will be built on the corner of Lake Woodmoor Drive and Lower Lake Drive.

I am a resident of Woodmoor on a residential street just north of highway 105. I ask for the rejection of the 35-home development plan that is proposed and the allowance of a more reasonable development of the land.

Beyond the also-important concern of the larger-lot aesthetics of most of Woodmoor, two factors demand attention in this decision: already-existing difficulties with traffic and water.

First, it seems a traffic study was done by the investors which indicated that the impact would be insignificant. I respectfully say that this study is difficult to believe unless its area of concern was disingenuously narrowed too much. Adding more homes in that area will exacerbate current challenging conditions. As a person who lives here, I can state that the traffic load on Woodmoor Drive on the north side of 105 is often horrendous, making it very difficult to turn left out of Lake Woodmoor Drive coming from the library or from the bank right there - and this is on good weather days. Add in snow, and it is downright scary. Ice makes it nearly impossible to make this turn safely. There are insufficient alternate routes available out of the general neighborhood to give drivers another reasonable choice. The thought of even more traffic being loaded into this turn is very disturbing.

Second, and even more serious, is the water situation in our area. We already have an overload on the system and have to ration watering every year regardless of the precipitation level. Home owners notice progressively decreasing pressure rendering sprinkler systems malfunctional. Additionally, we've seen several conversations between highly frustrated area residents regarding more serious problems with water in several neighborhoods over the past three or four years, particularly following the dense residential developments that have already occurred on the south side of 105.

Please reconsider the proposed development at "The Beach at Woodmoor" property. Require a less dense plan that will create a lower impact to existing problems than would be added by the proposal as it stands.

We own property adjacent to the proposed neighborhood, The Beach at Woodmoor. We attended the community meeting with the developers last week. Like many others, we are very disappointed to hear about the number of proposed homes. Woodmoor is such a unique and spacious neighborhood. As neighbors, we would really like to see this land developed similarly to the homes immediately surrounding it.

We also had several concerns with the plan that was presented.

- 1. The "hammerhead" street design for the southern homes will not provide safety to children in those homes in regard to large vehicles unable to turn around: snow plows, UPS/FedEx, moving trucks, etc.
- 2. Safety of children from the Northern neighborhood crossing Lake Woodmoor Drive to attend the elementary school.
- 3. The blind curve on Lower Lake Rd where the new intersection is proposed.
