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Dear Honorable County Commissioner,

It has just come to my attention that there is an upcoming hearing to rezone 12470 Black Forest Road from A-5 to CC-5. I was first informed of this by a friend who is a resident near the said property. I have heard both sides of the argument, and I tend to object to this rezoning.

While allowing this wholesale business may seem harmless, what happens when this property is sold in the future? I am extremely troubled by all of the rezoning in the areas leading up to the forest. My family and I moved to Black Forest because of the rural nature, less traffic and population, and a respect for the land and wildlife. This way of life is being infringed upon with all of the rezoning of agricultural, rural land to commercial.
