Fire District Capabilities

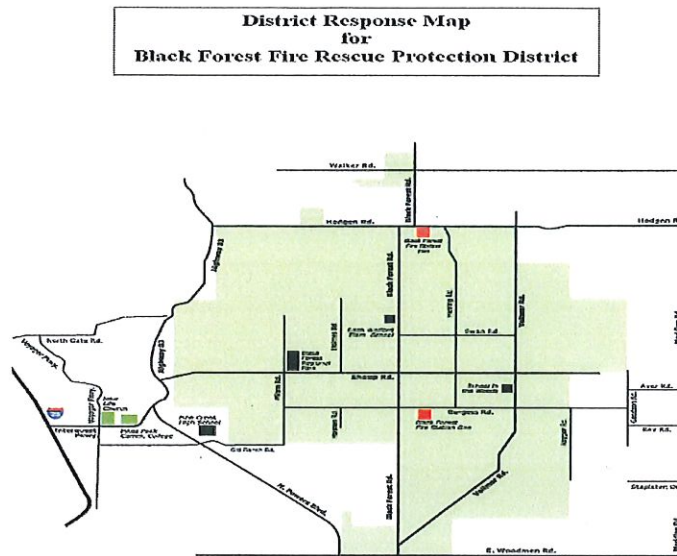
Black Forest Fire Rescue is a title 32 Special Fire District providing 24/7 Fire protection services to include:

- Fire suppression both structural and wildland,
- Emergency Medical services to include advanced life support and transport,
- Hazardous Materials Response
- Rescue.

We operate with a daily staffing of 8 firefighters and 3 command staff (7am-5pm M-F). Our initial response is with a type 1 engine carrying 750 gallons of water and a Tender/pumper carrying 1800 gallons of water. We have automatic mutual aid agreements in place with our neighboring fire agencies to provide an additional response. If our mutual aid partners can respond they would provide the following additional support of two engines (1000 gallons) two water tenders (5000 gallons), a ladder truck, and an additional command officer. Our personnel response would be 7-9 personnel on the initial alarm with an additional 7-9 personnel from our mutual aid partners. We will also receive additional command staff and firefighters to assist with command-and-control activities as the incident progresses.

Service area

Black Forest Fire Rescue services an area of approximately 54 square miles from research parkway to the south and Walker Road to the north Hwy 83 to the west and Vollmer Road to the east. We routinely provide mutual aid to our neighboring districts. BFFRPD provides Fire and EMS services to approximately 15,000 residents and visitors. Black Forest is primarily a residential community with some small business and light commercial.



Wildland Response

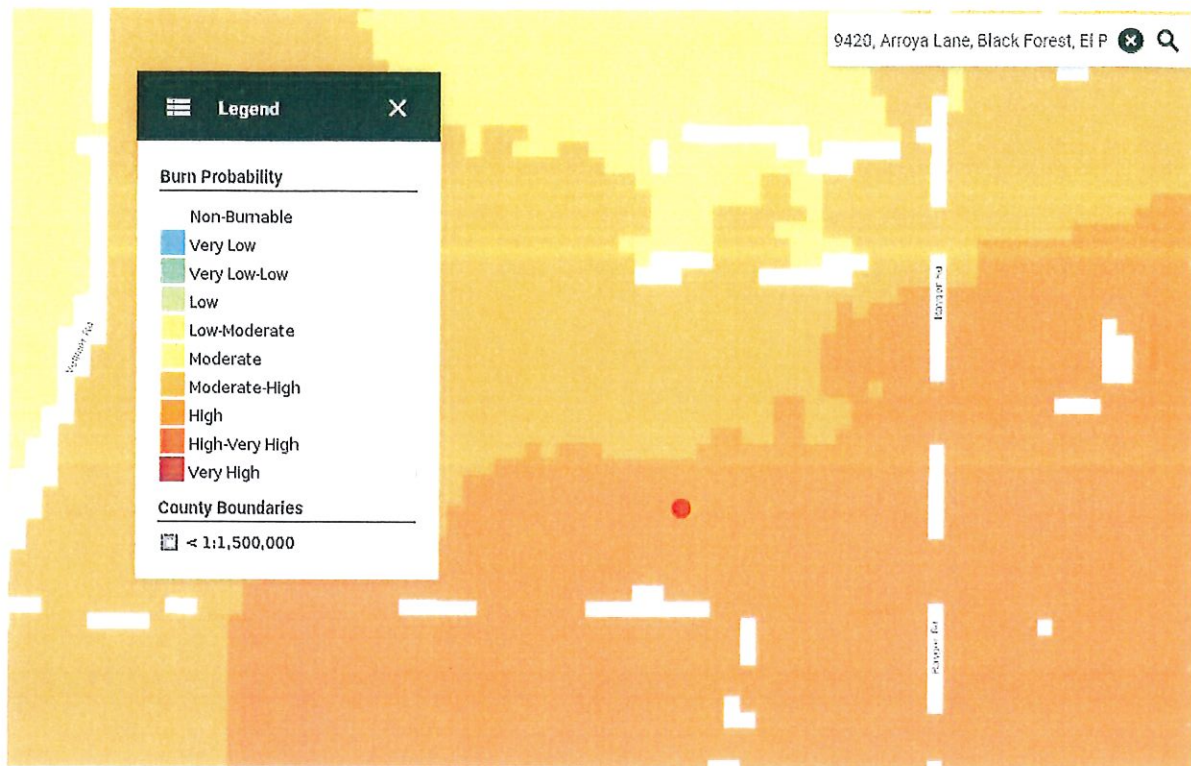
Black Forest Fire Rescue has a robust wildland response plan to include our mutual aid partners in the region. Initial response to wildland fire reports will be.

1. Type 3 and or Type 6 wildland response units with a type 1 engine with 750 gallons of water.
2. 1800-gallon water tender.
3. Chief officer or command personnel.

Mutual aid response will be.

1. Type 6 wildland units and type 1 engines.
2. Water Tenders carrying upwards of 5,000 gallons.

Black Forest Fire Rescue operates out of two stations which are manned 24/7.

Average Response Time: 11-13 minutes

Type 6 Engine (742) wildland engine

Response times

From the two Black Forest Fire Rescue station our average response time is 8.77 min to all calls within our district boundaries based on statistical reports spanning the last 3 years.

Additional Information

Due to our robust response plan and water carrying capabilities our Insurance Services Organization (ISO) rating is a 5 for all areas within the fire district and a 4 if the property is within 1000 ft. of a functional fire hydrant connected to a pressurized and distributed water supply.
