

2. A description of the nature of the project (supported by drawings, photographs, specifications, sketch plans, etc., if appropriate.)

The Hay Creek Valley Subdivision project is proposing 20 single family rural residential parcels on 214.62 acres located south of Hay Creek and west of Highway 25 to the south of the Town of Monument. The site has one single family residence which shall remain in the western portion of the site. The remainder of the site is vacant grassland and pine forest. The site is currently zoned RR-5 and will remain with proposed parcels ranging in size from 5.5 to 17 acres.



4. Does the project involve or is it adjacent to any buildings 50 or more years old? (If so, give their addresses.)

The project site includes two structures, both listed as ranch structures, under the address 2855 Hay Creek Road. The older of the two was built in 1981 and the younger was built in 2015. No buildings are over the age of 50 years.

5. If there will be ground disturbance, indicate known previous uses, i.e., platted and graded, site of previous building, plowed, undisturbed.

The site is vacant grassland and pine forest with the two structures described in item 4. Other disturbances include the dirt entry road (Snow Mountain Heights) which spans approx. 5,250 feet and then splits into two drives, both approx. 1,000 feet.
