This is to inform you that the above referenced request for approval of an application for administrative relief to allow a rear setback of 16 feet where 20 feet is required for an attached deck within the Falcon View PUD (Planned Unit Development) zoning district was approved by the Planning and Community Development Director on August 30, 2021. It is the determination and finding of the Planning and Community Development Department (PCD) Director that the application meets the review criteria for Administrative Relief included in Section 5.5.1 of the El Paso County Land Development Code (2021). Current and future use of the property shall continue to be governed by the Falcon View PUD. Approval of the requested administrative relief application is subject to the following:

CONDITIONS AND NOTATION

Conditions

1. Any expansion or additions beyond the initial construction of the attached deck may require separate application(s) and approval(s) if the development requirements of the applicable zoning district cannot be met.
2. Approval of a site plan by the Planning and Community Development Department and issuance of a building permit from the Pikes Peak Regional Building Department are required prior to construction.

Notation

1. Physical variances approved for a proposed structure (except for lot area variances) are valid only if construction of the structure is initiated within twelve (12) months of the date of the approval.
